

Breakfast

To start your day off the right way, we serve a delicious breakfast made with produce from the local area. It includes homemade granolas, fresh bread, spreads, baked goods, juice and coffee.



Cathedral of The Dales

Just 100 yards from The Rose & Crown is
The Church of St Romald, often referred to as
The Cathedral of The Dales. We'd
recommended stopping here for half hour or
so and taking in the fascinating history and
stunning architecture.



Romaldkirk Walks

Next, head towards the centre of Romaldkirk and take a stroll around the village. Make your way down to the River Tees and join the Teesway footpath along to the village of Cotherstone. Return to Romaldkirk on the old railway line which is now an ideal footpath which carries on up to Mickleton and beyond.

Afternoon Tea

Head over to <u>Eggleston Hall and Gardens</u> for a delicious Afternoon Tea. Eggleston Hall is a Grade II listed Georgian building, dating back to the 16th century. A wide range of specialty teas and coffees are served to accompany freshly made scones and homemade cakes.



Headlam Hall

As an alternative afternoon, we'd recommend heading over to <u>Headlam Hall</u>, a 17th century country house. Enjoy either lunch or Afternoon Tea in the orangery, relax in the spa or enjoy a game of golf on the 9-hole golf course. Speak to our reception team who can help arrange your visit.



Dinner at The Rose & Crown

After a busy day in Teesdale, head back to The Rose & Crown for a delicious evening meal in our restaurant or bar area. Our menu is always seasonal and locally sourced, and behind the bar we have a selection of local cask ales including Black Sheep and Fifty 4.



Discover a taste of Cotherstone

Our region has some fantastic local suppliers and producers, and one of our favourites is Cotherstone Cheese, located just two miles down the road from The Rose & Crown in Cotherstone. Created by Joan and Alwin Cross, this cheese is related to Wensleydale and Swaledale and is a semi-hard, farmhouse cheese made from unpasteurised, full-fat Jersey cows' milk.

Cotherstone Cheese is hand made by Joan at Quarry House farm near Barnard Castle and it is matured for one to three months to give it a creamy, rich and buttery texture.

There are two versions of Cotherstone - a white version and blue-veined version called "Yorkshire Stilton". If you head over to Cotherstone, you can purchase both cheeses from the local post office, or you can select it as part of the cheese board on our dessert menu!







Explore on foot

Upper Teesdale is a walker's paradise

Take a short drive to Bowlees Visitor Centre and from there you can walk down to the River Tees at Low Force, a series of waterfalls and rapids. From here, follow the river a couple of miles up to High Force, England's tallest waterfall. A few more miles up the Tees you will find Cauldron Snout waterfall where the Tees emerges from Cow Green Reservoir. The rugged riverside path below takes you through a remarkable part of the North Pennines, an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty, a Natural Nature Reserve and a European Geopark.

We can provide packed lunches and also have drying/washing facilities if you get caught out by the Great British weather! Maps are available to borrow and our knowledgeable team can help you choose a walk to suit you and the conditions.




Fly Fishing

Try fly fishing with a local guide

Teesdale is great for fly fishing and you can choose between local reservoirs and the River Tees which is regarded as one of the best in the country for wild trout and grayling. This really is a remarkable place for fly fishing, with so much variation of water within short distances of each other. Enjoy wading in soft riffles and glassy glides or, on the higher stretches of the Tees where the river runs through rocky sections, you may be better with techniques like Tenkara.

We can arrange for Ollie, an expert guide, to accompany you for the day or to provide tuition for all levels from complete beginners to experts. He'll pick you up from our front door and can take you to the very best spots in the area.







Drive through the Dales
